Attorney General Chris Bentley told The Canadian Press this week he's "concerned about cost" when it comes to public inquiries.

The news comes ahead of the release of the Cornwall Public Inquiry's final report, set to be delivered Tuesday.

The Cornwall Public Inquiry was the most expensive in Canadian history, estimated to cost \$50 million.
