# Man pleads guilty to sodomy

Carl V. Stone, 65, who gave his address as Route 8, Elizaville, Columbia County, pleaded guilty to two third-degree sodomy charges Monday as he was arraigned in Albany County Court on four such counts, all involving two teen-age brothers.

Stone was accused in a sealed indictment returned Friday and opened Monday as his attorney, Michael Costello, surrendered him to authorities.

The indictment alleged that Stone engaged in deviate sexual intercourse with two youths on two occasions at a location off Crescent Road in the town of Colonie.

He pleaded guilty to counts accusing him of such conduct in the early evening of July 14. The

remaining charges accused him of committing sodomy "sometime in the month of June, 1981."

Costello told the court arrangements are being made for a psychiatric examination of the defendant.

Appearing before Judge Joseph Harris to enter a guilty plea in a drug case was Hugh Penk, 24, of 555 Fifth Ave., Troy.

Penk admitted criminal possession of a controlled substance, second degree, a Class A-II felony carrying a mandatory maximum sentence of life in prison.

The defendant had been accused of selling more than 2,000 tablets of LSD to an undercover State Police officer on Aug. 17 in Watervliet. He will be sentenced on Dec. 7.

## Man admits sodomy, faces examination

A 65-year-old Columbia County man will undergo a psychiatric examination after pleading guilty to two charges of third-degree sodomy in Albany County Court.

Carl V. Stone, 65, of Route 8, Elizaville, was accused in a sealed indictment of four counts of sodomy.

The indictment alleged Stone engaged in deviate sexual intercourse with two teen-age brothers on two occasions at a location off Crescent Road in the town of Colonie sometime in June, and on July 14.

In another Albany County Court case, Hugh Penk, 24, of 555 Fifth Ave., Troy, faces a life prison sentence Dec. 7 after pleading guilty Monday before Albany County Court Judge Joseph Harris to a charge of second-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance.

The case involved an Aug. 17 sale of 2,000 LSD tablets to an undercover state police officer.
