I assumed this was fact as S/Sgt Carter had advised me at the beginning of the selection process that he would be consulting with the crown in order to assist him in determining successful candidates.

In early November, 1999 I was advised by Kurt Fraser that he had been told by Gerry Holiday that Perry Dunlop who had applied for a position in the SACA unit was not going to get the position. Holiday had told Fraser that Rick Carter had advised him that his reason for the decision was that Murray MacDonald (the Crown Attorney) had told him that he would not prosecute

Dunlop's cases because Dunlop had lied in court on a previous matter.

I found this information very damaging in respect of Perry Dunlop's career as a police officer. This was an alleged criminal act that obviously Dunlop had never been made aware of. That same day I met and discussed this allegation with Perry Holiday

who repeated the same story  
he had told Fraser. Fraser  
advised me that as President  
of the Cornwall Police Association  
it was his responsibility to  
notify Dunlop of the allegation.
